At our 2015 Annual Banquet, we introduced the Hope Capacity Building Campaign goal of raising \$800,000.00 to address key needs in the areas of facilities, staff, and programs. Thanks be to God and the generosity of you, our faithful donors, we have raised almost \$850,000.00!

Construction has begun on our main building, which includes a roof replacement, a new fire alarm system, a fire prevention standpipe, and the installation of 30 transitional housing rooms on our 3rd floor for veterans in crisis and men who have procured full-time employment!

Your overwhelming generosity also enabled us to add an Intake Coordinator to our staff. Our goals for 2017 are to renovate our kitchen and emergency shelter bathroom and laundry facility, improvements that will benefit our residents on a daily basis!

On behalf of our Board of Directors and Staff, thank you so very much for your outpouring of love and support toward so many in need seeking refuge through the Mission! We are excited to see more lives restored through the Gospel!

Your continued financial support is crucial to our daily operations. All of the funds we have raised for the Hope Campaign are restricted for use toward our stated campaign goals, and they cannot be used to operate the Mission. As we enter our busiest time of the year with our overflow Code Blue Program, we are feeding, sheltering, and ministering to more men than ever. Since the end of October, our Code Blue overflow winter program has been open. Our gym, full of cots, sleeping bags, and pillows, has become an emergency shelter for those plagued by homelessness during the bitter-cold months. Many men come in scared and anxious, having no other resources to turn to in the middle of winter. They are embraced with dignity and respect, and their fears quickly subside as they realize they will be safe at the Mission.
